



Professor Jane Grimson

Professor Grimson is a computer engineering graduate from the University of Dublin, Trinity College, and holds a Masters and Doctorate in Computer Science from the Universities of Toronto and Edinburgh, respectively. She returned to Trinity College as a lecturer in Computer Science in 1980, is a former Dean of

Engineering and of Research, and served as Vice-Provost from 2001-2005. She is a Past-President of the Institution of Engineers of Ireland, the Irish Academy of Engineering, the Irish Computer Society, and the Healthcare Informatics Society of Ireland and former Chair of the Irish Research Council for Science, Engineering and Technology. She is a Fellow of the Royal Academy of Engineering, the Irish Academy of Engineering, Engineers Ireland, the Irish Computer Society, and the Royal Academy of Medicine of Ireland. She is also a member of the Royal Irish Academy. She is a strong advocate of the open access movement and as a member of the former European Research Advisory Council, she led the working group on *Scientific Publication: policy on open access* which recommended the adoption of an open access mandate for all research funded by the European Union.

She holds a personal chair in Health Informatics and is currently on a partial secondment to the Health Information and Quality Authority in Ireland as Director of Health Information and Deputy Chief Executive.
