Speaker Profile: Nick Thompson

Nick Thompson is CEO of the Tony Blair Africa Governance Initiative (AGI), working to achieve AGI's mission to make government work for the world's poorest people. He leads all of AGI's work in Africa and the rest of the world and makes the case for effective government as the factor that will enable African countries to achieve transformative change and move beyond aid. Nick reports to the AGI Board of Trustees.

Nick has been part of the AGI story from the beginning and has worked across the leadership team as Director of Projects 2009-11 and as AGI's first Chief Operating Officer from 2011-2012 before being appointed as CEO in 2013. Nick led our early work in Freetown, Sierra Leone and set up the programmes in Nigeria, Kenya, Malawi and Liberia.

His early career was in the UK civil service, advising Ministers on a range of policy areas including energy, climate change, employment and EU issues and working in the Department for Business, Cabinet Office, Ofgem and UK Permanent Representation to the EU.



Mahmoud Mohieldin is the World Bank's Senior Vice President for the 2030 Development Agenda, United Nations Relations, and Partnerships. He is in charge of coordinating the World Bank Group's efforts to strengthen partnerships with the United Nations and multilateral development institutions.

Prior to joining the World Bank, Mohieldin held numerous leading positions in the government of Egypt and served on several boards of directors in the Central Bank of Egypt and the corporate sector. He was a member of the Commission on Growth and Development and selected a Young Global Leader of the World Economic Forum in 2005.

His professional experience extends into the academic arena as a professor of economics at Cairo University, also serving as member of the board of several universities in Egypt and holding leading positions in national and regional research centers and think tanks. He has authored numerous publications and articles in leading journals in the fields of finance and development in English and Arabic. He received his Ph.D. in economics from the University of Warwick, M.Sc in Economic and Social Policy Analysis from the University of York, and B.Sc from Cairo University.

Renowned for his expertise and forward-thinking approach towards corporate integrations, Mr. Diallo played a lead role in shaping the development and structure of the DHL Logistics Division through the Exel integration, which remains the largest corporate integration in the transportation and logistics industry to date.

Mr. Diallo is Chairman of the supervisory board of Amref Health Africa in Germany, member of the board of ARC Insurance and member of the Universal Business School of Mumbai. He was born in Senegal and is fluent in several languages including English, German, French, Fulani, Wolof and Spanish.

Mr. Dominique Lafont, born on March 29, 1961, is a French corporate leader. In 2006, he became Managing Director for Africa in the Bolloré Group. On January 1, 2012, he was named President of Bolloré Africa Logistics, the Group subsidiary combining all of the Group's infrastructure and logistic activities both within Africa and outside the continent, across the major emerging countries trading with Africa

Mr. Lafont began his professional career in 1987 with the Arthur Andersen audit firm. In 1995, he worked as the Director of Industrial Participations of the Rivaud Group, before joining the Bolloré Group following its friendly takeover of the Rivaud Group in 1997.

By 1999, Dominique Lafont became the Group's Financial Director for Africa. He then became the Managing Director for the Group activities in English-speaking Africa. From 2006 to January 2015, he the entire range of Bolloré Group activities throughout Africa.

He is currently a Senior Advisor to KKR and CEO of Lafont Africa Corporation, an advisory structure helping private companies and public bodies to cope with challenges in Africa such as business development (in a specific country or in a sub region or over the continent) , restructuring and investment.
