Analyze contemporary issues connected to critical narratives of public safety approaches emphasizing the necessity for an increased commitment to community policing programs.

Session 2 (10:10-11:10 a.m.)

2A: What is Blockchain Technology?

This class explores the fundamentals and applications of Blockchain technology. You will learn about the decentralized peer-to-peer network, distributed ledger, and trust model that define Blockchain technology. We will examine the basic components of Blockchain, its operations, underlying algorithms, and the essentials of trust. We will look at private and public Blockchain networks similar to Bitcoin and Ethereum, as well as concepts of smart contracts, proof of work, and proof of stack. Finally, we will address the relationships among Blockchain technology, Internet of Things (IoT), artificial intelligence (AI), cybersecurity, and digital transformation.

2B: Star Trek: Lessons in Intergalactic Communication

How can technology ensure that this does not happen again? The talk will explore solutions from Math and Machine Learning to address the problem of fake news and cognitive hacking on Twitter. The talk is planned to be based on the book the speaker authored, titled, "Veracity of Big Data using Machine Learning and other techniques." The material will be covered without assuming a lot of math / technical background, so should be easy to understand to anyone who is interested in these topics.

3E: How to Build More Confidence

Session 4 (1:30-2:30 p.m.)

4A: Effective Communication Through Theater Practices
