



REPAIR LAB HOUSE RULES

- The work carried out in the Repair Lab is performed free of charge on a voluntary basis by the repair experts at hand.
- Visitors carry out the repairs themselves whenever possible, but repair experts on site can help and teach you if necessary.
- Bring an open mind and willingness to learn and share knowledge and skills;
- Bring tools and/or materials that you think will assist with mending your broken item (or materials that may assist with mending other people's items)
- Any use of new materials such as leads, plugs, fuses or applications will be paid for separately.
- Try to repair your own broken items and help other participants where you can.
- The aim of the workshop is for you to learn practical skills in repair, and to have fun doing that!
- Repair Lab is not intended to be a free repair service where our repair volunteers do all the work and you take your fixed item home without having any idea of how to fix it if it breaks again!
- To cut down on unnecessary waiting times during busy periods, a maximum of **ONE broken item per person** will be examined. The visitor will join the back of the queue if there is a second item for repair.
- The fact that the repairs are being performed by unpaid volunteers reflects the allocation of risks and limitation of liability.
Neither the organisers of the Repair Lab nor the repair experts are liable for any loss that may result from advice or instructions concerning repairs, for the loss of items handed over for repair, for indirect or consequential loss or for any other kind of loss resulting from work performed in the Repair Lab.
- Visitors have to sign a waiver form before they work with a volunteer repairer.
- Visitors offering broken items for repair do so at their own risk.
- Experts making repairs offer no guarantee for the repairs carried out with their help and are not liable if objects that are repaired in the Repair Lab turn out not to work properly at home.
- Repair experts are entitled to refuse to repair certain objects.
- Repair experts are not obliged to reassemble disassembled appliances that cannot be repaired.
- Visitors to Repair Lab are solely responsible for the tidy removal of broken objects that could not be repaired.
- We want to produce as little waste as possible, so please keep this in mind when mending.
