We use the vehicle of a fashion and hospitality business – including a clothing label, retail shop, digital printing studio, café and a catering business – to create meaningful social change. We provide TAFE level training, work experience, volunteer opportunities and employment in fashion, manufacturing, retail and hospitality, creating education and employment opportunities and pathways.

Kate Twyford is in Corporate Affairs at the National Australia Bank. Working along side the Foundation for Young Australians, \$20 Boss is the ultimate in-school student start-up challenge. This social enterprise program gives every student a chance to build a small business. Students are given \$20 each, through hands-on experience these mini entrepreneurs plan, budget, market and run their business idea building innovation, enterprise and financial literacy skills. NAB employees also act as business coaches.
