Course Description

This intermediate level, two day course will address physical therapy management of individuals following a stroke. The focus will be on assessment, treatment planning, goal setting and progression of patients through the rehabilitation process: from early medical stabilization to management of chronic stroke conditions.

This course will integrate concepts of neuroplasticity, principles of motor learning, and evidence based practice to inform treatment decisions. Topics highly relevant to the stroke population, such as pusher syndrome, neglect, apraxia, orthopedic complications, gait theory and strategies, the hemiplegic UE, and cerebellar dysfunction will be discussed in detail.
