

Comprehensive Physical Therapy Management of the Individual following Traumatic Brain Injury

This 1.5 day intermediate level course will cover the continuum of physical therapy care for adults following a Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI). Evaluation strategies and interventions specific to this population and common comorbidities will be considered. Video case presentations will guide discussion of the principles of evaluation, treatment planning, prescription, and advancement in low, moderate and high functioning patients with traumatic brain injury. The use of medical and functional outcome tools will be reviewed for this population. Special topics related to vision, behavior, learning and cognition, movement disorders, and the pediatric client will be addressed on Day 2. Clinicians treating individuals with TBI across the continuum of care will gain new insights and strategies for managing this challenging population.

Course Objectives

- 1. Describe the etiology and pathophysiology underlying TBI
- 2. Develop a framework for physical therapy examination for patients with TBI
- 3. Identify 3 common medical complications and comorbidities in individuals with TBI, and discuss how they impact treatment planning.
- 4. Discuss the principles and practices of evidence-guided treatment for functions and activities of individuals with TBI.
- 5. Apply examination findings to optimize treatment planning and goal setting.
