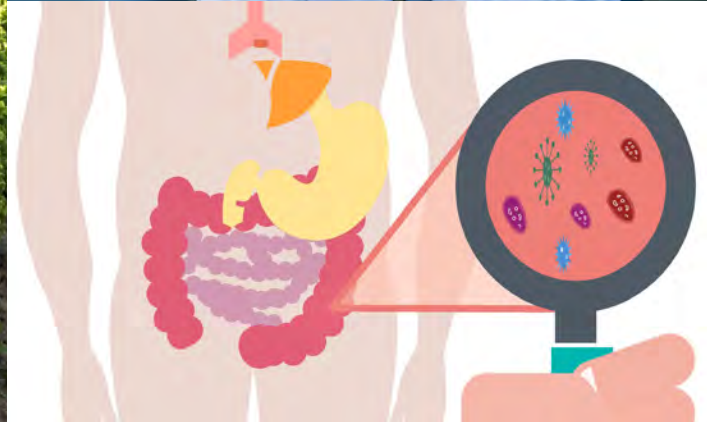
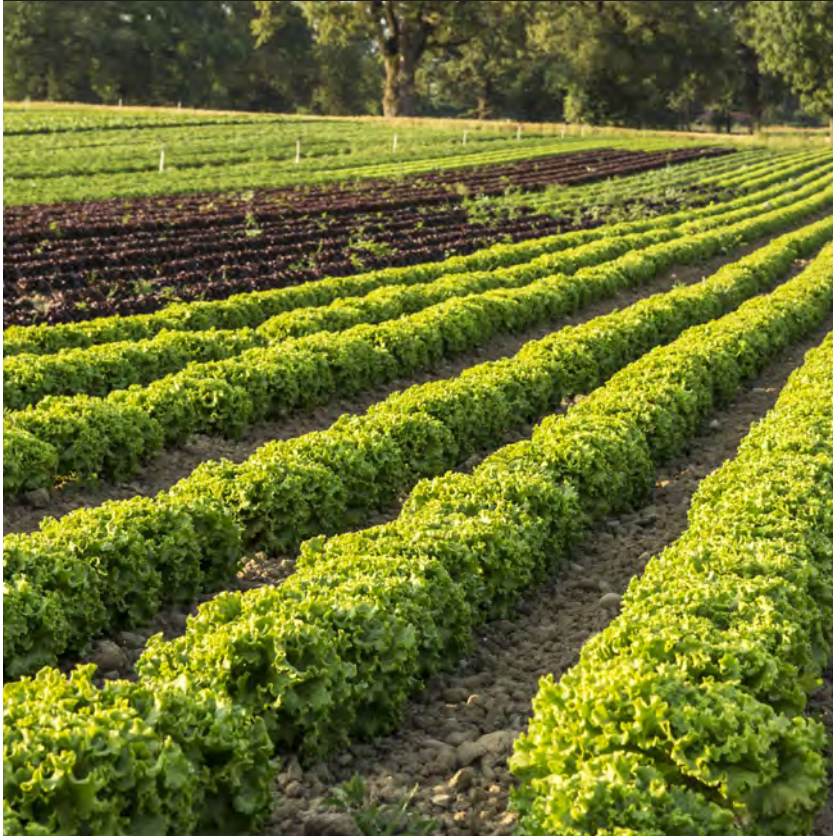


The Microbiomes: From Field to Food to Human Gut
