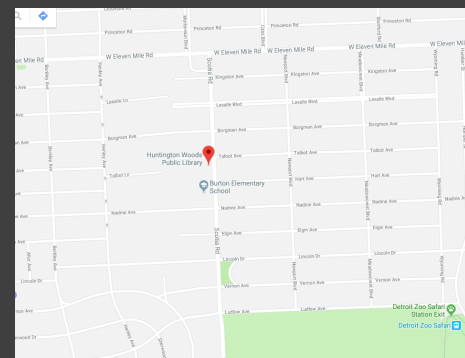

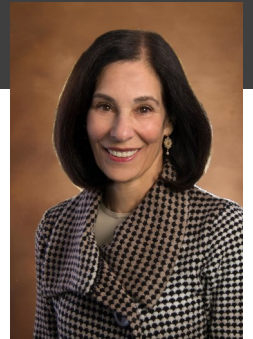


Rony Foumia, Pharmacy District Leader **Appointed Official with Governor Snyder**

Rony Foumia has been a licensed pharmacist in Michigan since 1999. He started as an intern for Arbor Drugs in 1997 and graduated from The Wayne State University School of Pharmacy in 1999. Rony worked as a pharmacist for CVS from 1999 to 2007 and was promoted to District Manager from 2007 to 2013. Rony moved to Rite Aid in 2014 and is currently a District Manager in Michigan. He has managed over 200 different drug stores in Michigan since 2007 and has seen the profession of pharmacy drastically change. Rony was appointed by Governor Snyder in November, 2017 to the Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee. He is also a guest lecturer at The Wayne State University School of Pharmacy and teaches about community pharmacy practice and the opioid epidemic. He has also been giving lectures, town hall events throughout Michigan about the Opioid crisis.

Commissioner Helaine Zack **Oakland County, District 18**

Commissioner Zack earned Bachelors of Arts and Masters of Social Work degrees at the University of Michigan. She was elected in 2002 and currently serves the cities of Ferndale, Hazel Park, Huntington Woods, Oak Park and the Charter Township of Royal Oak. Commissioner Zack has been a social worker active in the employee assistance program field for more than 35 years. Throughout her professional career, Commissioner Zack has been an advocate for vulnerable citizens, including those dealing with mental illness, substance abuse, domestic violence and traumatic events. She has also worked to improve and promote regional transportation.

Trisha Zizumbo is one of the Health Education Supervisors at Oakland County Health Division and facilitates the Oakland County Prescription Drug Partnership.
