

Gillebrìde MacMillan is from the island of South Uist in the Outer Hebrides, and Gaelic is the first language of his family. After completing a degree in Celtic Studies at the University of Glasgow and a Masters Degree from the University of the Highlands and Islands, Gillebrìde now works in the Celtic and Gaelic Department at University of Glasgow.

He is a Gaelic translator, a published writer, and has worked on the Tobar an Dualchais archiving project. He regularly sings and teaches Scottish Gaelic song at festivals and cèilidhs in Scotland, Europe and the United States. Well-known in the Scottish Gaelic world, Gillebrìde is gaining fans who are new to the language through his performance as Gwyllyn the Bard in the Starz television production of Outlander, based on the popular Diana Gabaldon novel. He has released two albums, Thogainn Ort Fonn and Air Fòrladh.
