Activities on offer will include sculpture workshops, lectures given by selected artists and an educational programme with universities.

The People Behind Cheeseburn

Joanna Riddell has been developing the idea of Cheeseburn over the last 3 years. As well as national and international research she has delivered a pilot exhibition and various open days to test the house and grounds with large numbers of visitors and to gauge public interest. In 2013 Joanna was appointed to the Advisory Board of the Peggy Guggenheim Collection, Venice. Later that year Joanna joined forces with Arts Consultant, Matthew Jarratt.

Matthew worked as a manager for Arts Council England since 1999 and was behind many of the sculpture and visual arts developments in the North East. Matthew began working independently in 2013 and is managing sculpture projects and working with cultural organisations in the North East, Manchester, London and China. In 2014 Matthew joined the council of the Royal Society of British Sculptors.

Together they have put a plan in place for the development of Cheeseburn and hope to work in partnership with regional arts organisations, artists, businesses, cultural and tourism groups.

Cheeseburn will operate as a cultural project, engaging the public whilst supporting artists and designers. Work will be exhibited in partnership with the artists.

Location

Our location at Cheeseburn is a huge asset in the Tyne Valley close to Hadrian's Wall. Despite our rural setting we have excellent transport links nearby with Newcastle/AI, Hexham/A69 and Newcastle Airport.

We are located 12.5 miles from Newcastle City Centre on the B6324 Stamfordham Road
