Galway City

Galway City was originally formed from a small fishing village located in the area at the Spanish Arch called “the Claddagh” where River Corrib meets Galway Bay. Galway later became a walled town in the year 1232 after the territory was captured by the Anglo Normans lead by Richhard De Burgo.

Today Galway City is thriving, bohemian, cultural city on the western coast of Ireland. Along with being popular sea side destination with beautiful beaches and long winding promenade, Galway is often referred to as the “most Irish” of Ireland’s cities, as it’s the only one where your likely to hear Irish spoken in the streets, shops and pubs.

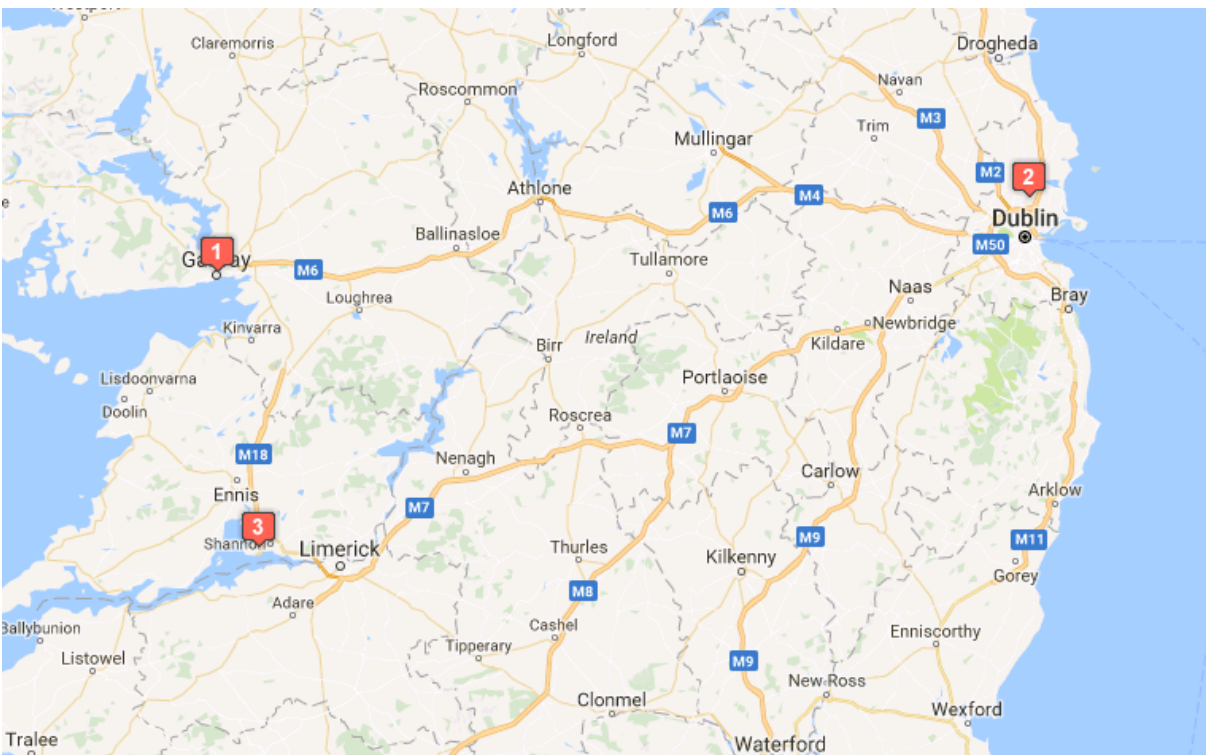


1 – Galway City
